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Your guide to Circuito de Navarra



Welcome to the **new** Circuito de Navarra!

Circuito de Navarra is one of Spain's leading motorsport facilities, superbly located near to the famous Rioja wine region. It was completely transformed in 2024 following a two-phase multi-million Euro upgrade programme undertaken by owner MotorSport Vision (MSV).

The alterations, which included a 650-metre extension and major resurfacing, have turned the circuit into one of Europe's most spectacular and impressive venues. And the faster, more flowing layout has vastly improved the driving and riding experience, whilst enabling more overtaking in competitive racing.

The stunning facility, which was originally built to the highest standards by the regional government and first launched in 2010, boasts 32 first-class pit garages, 27,500 square metres of asphalt paddock space, a superb new restaurant and spacious administration, operations and hospitality spaces. MSV has also made key improvements

to the general infrastructure, safety features and communications/networking, in addition to countless detail changes.

Whether you're visiting as a competitor, trackday participant or for any other reason, this guide will provide more information on the venue and how to get there, as well as recommendations on things to do. We've also suggested places to stay, and where to go for food and drink in the two biggest cities closest to the circuit: Logroño and Pamplona.

We're confident you'll be amazed by the level of quality offered at Circuito de Navarra, and the incredible landscape, scenery and hospitality in the region. The superb management team, led by Inma Lezana, works extremely hard to ensure that everyone that visits has a fantastic and memorable experience, and they look forward to seeing you soon!

Getting here **Driving/Ferry**

Located directly next to the Autovía A-12 highway, Circuito de Navarra is easily accessible by road at Junction 58.

Bilbao

Bilbao is home to the closest ferry port, with departures from Portsmouth twice weekly. The average drive time to the venue from here is around two hours.

Santander

An alternative ferry port within a reasonable drive time of Circuito de Navarra is Santander, which is also served by boats from Portsmouth.

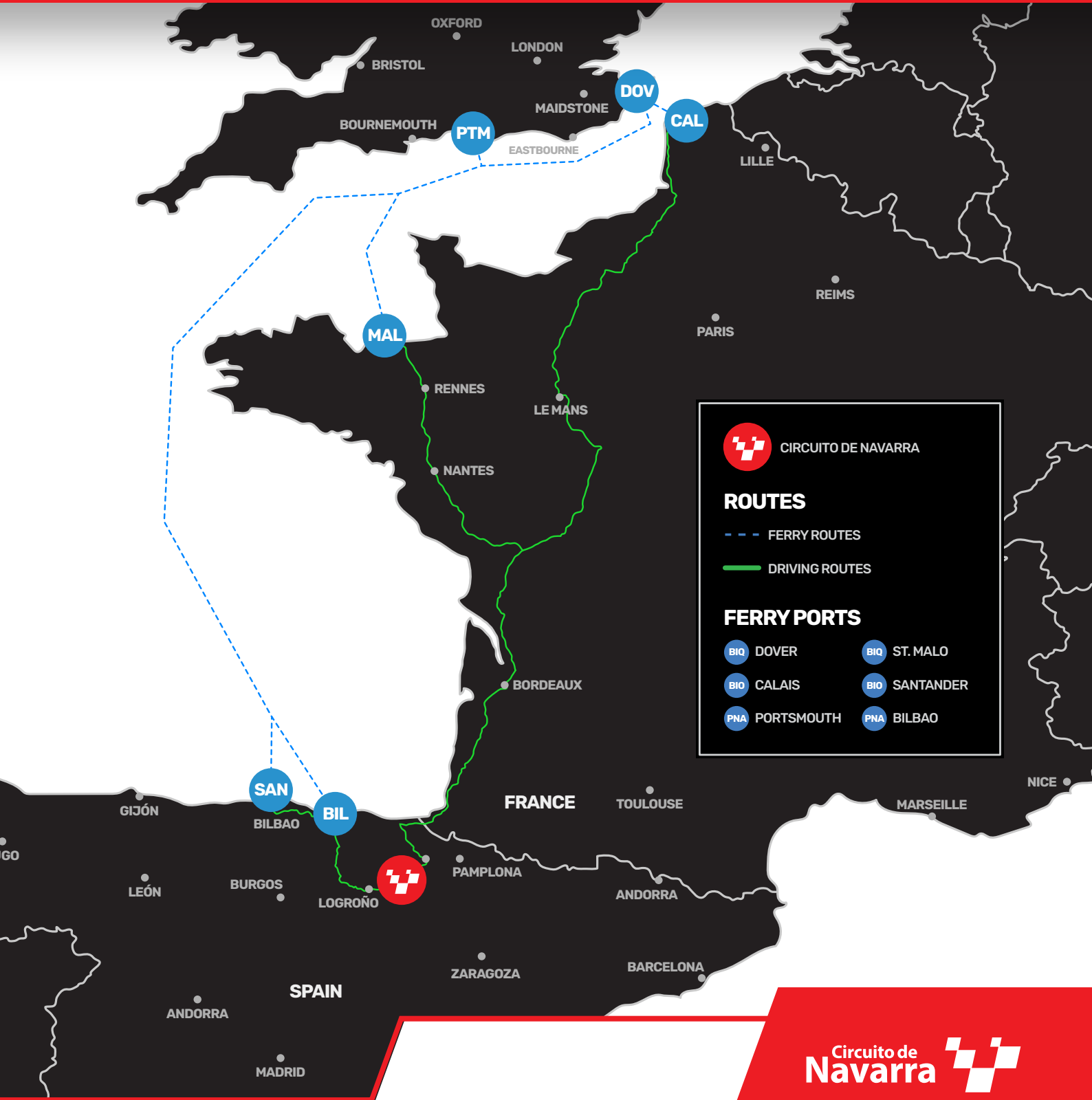
This is approximately three hours from the circuit.

St. Malo

The port of St. Malo in France is served regularly by cross Channel ferries and is around nine hours away from Circuito de Navarra by road.

Calais

If driving from the UK directly via the Dover-Calais ferry route, a typical journey will take around 14 hours by road. The fastest route will involve some tolls.



Getting here Flying

The circuit is located close to several airports, including some served internationally from the UK, with a typical two-hour flight time from London.

Bilbao

Bilbao Airport is the closest international airport to Circuito de Navarra, with frequent flights available from London Gatwick and Manchester Airport.

Zaragoza

Slightly further away from the circuit than Bilbao, Zaragoza Airport is another viable option with a reasonable drive time to Circuito de Navarra. Regular flights are scheduled from London Stansted.

Madrid

As an alternate, you can fly from London Gatwick to Madrid Airport, Then get an onward flight to Pamplona Airport.

Pamplona*

A 45-minute drive from the circuit, Pamplona Airport is served daily by domestic flights from Madrid, with some commercial flights also welcomed from outside Spain.

Logroño*


A 25-minute drive from the circuit, Logroño Airport is served by domestic flights from Madrid. It also welcomes private flights.


Biarritz (France)


Located a short drive away in France, Biarritz Pays Basque Airport welcomes frequent flights from London Stansted, with services from London Gatwick also available during the winter months.

Local Area Logroño

The nearest city to Circuito de Navarra is Logroño, the capital of the La Rioja region. It's about a 20 minute drive from the circuit. It is a vibrant, typical Spanish city, with a wealth of history. You'll find a plethora of restaurants with outdoor seating to soak up the historic charm and bustling atmosphere with a glass of local wine and some tasty delicacies. It is home to the "Calle del Laurel", an infamous street lined with lively pinchos (local version of tapas) bars right in the city centre.

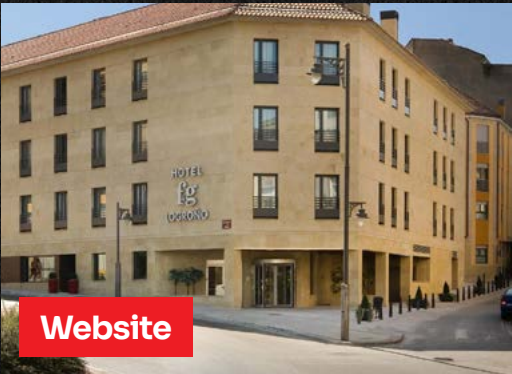

Bodegas Ontañón, El Templo del Vino

This is one of the most special wineries in the region, just 5 minutes from the centre of Logroño.



Concatedral de Santa María de la Redonda

This church is beautifully decorated and the painting is attributed to Michelangelo. Definitely worth the visit.



Bodega Viña Real

A modern winery, featuring the impressive architectural design of Philippe Mazieres.



Museo de la Rioja

In this museum, which is free to enter, you can discover the local colour and the history of La Rioja through the time.



Calle San Juan

Where Laurel is brash, in your face and loud, this is somewhat more relaxed, so explore it at your own pace.



Iglesia de San Bartolomé

This is the oldest church in Logroño.

Local Area Pamplona

The next nearest city, and the capital of the Navarra region, is Pamplona. It is approximately a 45 minute drive from the Circuito de Navarra. It is perhaps best known for the Running of the Bulls – the Fiesta de San Fermín – made famous by Ernest Hemingway. It takes place every July, attracting spectators and daredevil participants from all over the world. With medieval fortress walls, gothic cathedrals and plenty of buildings of architectural interest, Pamplona offers a rich taste of history, all in easy walking distance. The Plaza del Castillo square is the heart of the city, surrounded by more bars and restaurants than you could possibly hope for, with everything from casual tapas bars to high end dining. The Navarra region wine can also give La Rioja a run for its money!



Gran Hotel La Perla

A 5 star hotel located in the heart of the Plaza del Castillo square, with large, airy rooms named after historical figures who have stayed there. With such a central location, you won't need to wander far to experience the atmosphere and culinary delights on offer.

Plaza del Castillo

Plaza del Castillo is the lively central square of Pamplona's Old Town. It boasts an ensemble of architecture, tapas bars and a charming mix of locals, tourists and street performers.



Old Town

Also known as Casco Viejo, this area is lined with narrow cobbled streets and striking tall buildings. Surrounding the district are the city walls established between the 16th and 18th centuries.



Pamplona Cathedral

Pamplona Cathedral looms over a cluster of narrow alleys in the Old Town. Marvel at the majestic beauty of its neoclassical exterior, which makes way for a vastly decorated Gothic interior.



Pamplona City Hall

Pamplona City Hall is an administrative headquarters instantly recognisable for the decoration on its exterior.



Café Iruña

Café Iruña is a Pamplona institution that has been serving customers for more than 100 years. It was a popular haunt of the Nobel Prize-winning American writer Ernest Hemingway.



Museo de Navarra

Housed in a former medieval hospital, this superb museum has an eclectic collection of archaeological finds and art, including Goya's Marqués de San Adrián.



Ciudadela

The walls and bulwarks of the grand fortified citadel were built between 1571 and 1645. They're considered one of the best examples of military architecture from the Spanish Renaissance.



Plaza de Toros

This is where you'll find the Centro Temático del Encierro y los Sanfermines, a space dedicated to the city's bull-running traditions.



Mirador del Caballo Blanco

Here you can enjoy some of the most incredible views in the city, overlooking the Argua river and the mountains.



Plaza Consistorial

The square is also home to many historical buildings, including the City Hall, which dates back to the 15th century.

How to access Circuito de Navarra when driving on the A-12 motorway from Pamplona or Logroño

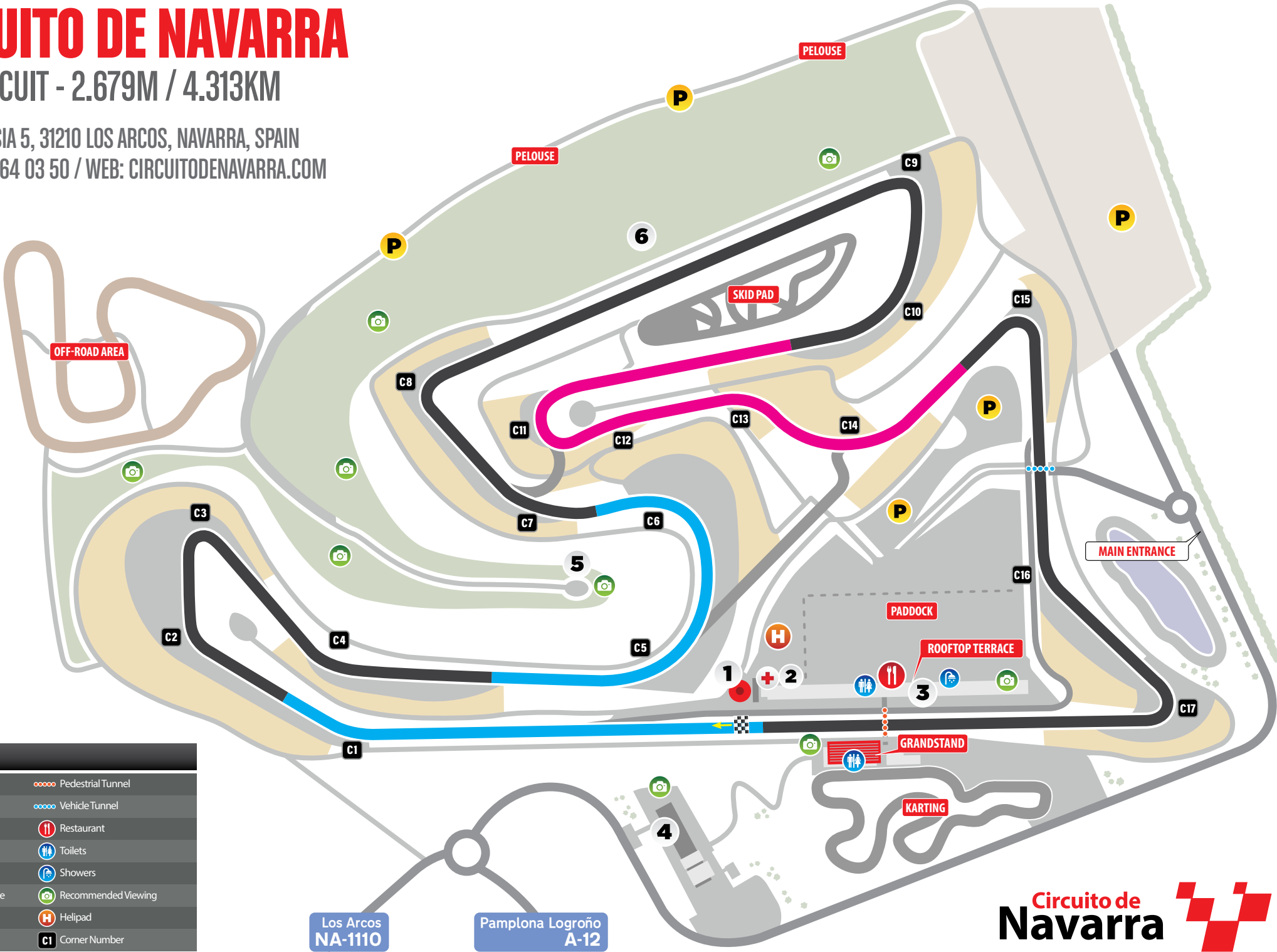
