Jaguar XJR-15

The Jaguar XJR-15 is one of the rarest and most exclusive Jaguars ever built, with just 53 examples produced. Derived directly from the Le Mans-winning XJR-9 and developed by JaguarSport and Tom Walkinshaw Racing.

The Jaguar Heritage Daimler Trust are bringing their famous 1988 Le Mans winning Jaguar XJR-9 to display and demo on-circuit. This Le Mans winning Jaguar, driven by Jan Lammers, Johnny Dumfries and Andy Wallace, completed 394 laps and covered a distance of 5332.79km (3313.63 miles).

1974 V12 Jaguar E-Type Group 44

This car marked the beginning of Jaguar's hugely successful partnership with Bob Tullius and the legendary Group 44 team in the USA. This car will be driven in the demo by former F1 and sports car legend, Mike Wilds.



1978 Jaguar XJS Group 44

The 1978 Jaguar XJS Group 44 Trans-Am is one of Jaguar's most successful racing cars, driven by Bob Tullius to the 1978 Trans-Am Category 1 Drivers' and Manufacturers' Championships after an extraordinary run of seven consecutive victories.



1983 Jaguar XJR-5 Group 44

A legendary race car that competed successfully throughout the 1984 and 1985 seasons in the US, winning the Road Atlanta 500 km Race in May 1985. This iconic V12-powered machine remains a significant part of Jaguar's competition heritage, and will form part of the special demo driven by Ben Collins.



Lister XJ-S Le Mans

The Lister XJ-S Le Mans features a 7.0-litre V12, dramatic wide-body styling and performance capable of exceeding 200mph. Built in extremely limited numbers, the car remains one of the most exclusive and powerful Jaguar-based road cars ever created.



1966 V12 Jaguar XJ13

The 1966 Jaguar XJ13 was created as a one-off prototype for a return to the 24 Hours of Le Mans. Although it never got the chance to race, its breathtaking Malcolm Sayer-designed bodywork and legendary V12 engine have made it one of the most beautiful and celebrated competition cars in Jaguar's history.



Jaguar XJ220

A very special display and on-track demo will feature five XJ220s at Oulton Park, an example of each colour ever made.
