Following investigations, I find that you are guilty of contravening the following Motorsport UK NCR(s):

Ch.2 Ann A Art.1.3 Gaining an unfair advantage

Brief Details:

Right of review received from Phil Bullen-Brown (Car 7) and was accepted based on the evidence presented at the RoR hearing. .

After reviewing several different onboard cameras it is clear that car 0 overtook car 5 under a single yellow flag (drivers right) at the start of the Hanger Straight. It was noted in the judicial hearing that there are several mitigating circumstances including -

- -- The marshal waving the yellow flag was a long distance from the circuit and the driver of car 0 stated he did not see the flag.
- -- The light panel further down the Hanger Straight on drivers right was not displaying a single yellow signal.
- -- It is clear the overtake had been completed before the double yellow signal.

As a result I feel that the driver of car 0 should have the place gained removed from him in the results and therefore car 0 is to receive a 1 place penalty in the race.

Evidence Relied Upon:

On board footage from cars 0, 7 and 11 (evidence car) viewed and drivers of cars 0 & 7 interviewed.
