Following investigations, I find that you are guilty of contravening the following Motorsport UK NCR(s):

Ch.12 App.8 Art.1.7.k Failure to comply with Black & Orange flag signals

## **Brief Details:**

Following the request from the Duty Scrutineer to bring car 94 in to the Pit Lane as it was smoking the competitor continued to circulate for multiple laps until the Chequared Flag because of his position. This is despite the driver being fully aware of what the issue with the vehicle was (due to loose dip stick - oil leaking on right hand corners) and the potential issues which oil on circuit can cause.

## **Evidence Relied Upon:**

Scrutineer Radio Message - Loose dip stick and therefore oil leaking on right hand corners.

Jordan Spencer - Car #94 - Has experienced this issue with the car previously, however he attended the pit lane to repair the car before rejoining circuit. On this occasion, due to position on circuit, he opted to continue instead. Driver fully aware of the flag signal and was apologetic.

Accordingly, under Motorsport UK NCR Ch.5a App.5 Art.2.1, I hereby order that you receive the following:

Verbal Warning

Additional Comments: Driver advised that the vehicle must be repaired overnight, it will be reinspected by Scrutineers on Sunday morning. If there is a repeat tomorrow further action will be taken and that this can be monitored during the year should a similar incident occur later in the season.

You are reminded of your right of appeal. Any penalties applied will be recorded by Motorsport UK in accordance with NCR Ch.5a App.5 Art.2.3
