Following investigations, I find that you are guilty of contravening the following Motorsport UK NCR(s):

Ch.12 App.7 Art.1.8 Causing a collision, repetition of serious mistakes or the appearance of a lack of control over the car (such as leaving the track) will be reported to the Clerk of Course and may entail the imposition of penalties up to and including the disqualification of any driver concerned.

Brief Details:

Following a number of regrids and extra formation laps for other incidents, on one of the extra green flag laps, car 32 and 27 came together out of T8.

The gantry display panel did display the message '1 green flag lap'.

Mitigating circumstance: Car 32 was quite far back from the lights and they were not in sight however the union jack 'repeater' was not dropped as per bulletin 7.

Car 32 is found to be at fault for the incident. The driver admits responsibility however noted this is their first race weekend. For those reasons, the penalty below is issued.
