Following investigations, I find that you are guilty of contravening the following Motorsport UK NCR(s):

Ch.12 App.7 Art.1.12 No competing Vehicle shall be driven in the reverse direction of the Track except for the minimum distance to remove it from an unexpected situation and then only under official supervision.

## **Brief Details:**

Driver Car 17 (Stefan Bostandjiev) and Team Manager interviewed by Clerk of the Course. Car 17 was reported to have driven the wrong direction on track. This was also recorded on circuit cameras. The driver admitted the offence but said that he was told to drive in the wrong direction by his mechanic. The Team Manager said that the mechanic was inexperienced but the driver is in his fourth season of car racing. In mitigation the manoeuvre was at low speed and officials were not considered to have been at risk.
