Following investigations, I find that you are guilty of contravening the following Motorsport UK NCR(s):

Ch.12 App.7 Art.1.8 Causing a collision, repetition of serious mistakes or the appearance of a lack of control over the car (such as leaving the track) will be reported to the Clerk of Course and may entail the imposition of penalties up to and including the disqualification of any driver concerned.

Brief Details:

In Race 2 at Turn 2 on Lap 1 there was contact involving Car 55 & Car 59 (Ava Dobson & Jason Pribyl). The drivers and their representatives were interviewed and on board video was reviewed from Cars 55, 59 and Car 9 (following). Also present was Driving Standards Advisor, Rob Barff. Car 55 (Ava Dobson) was found fully responsible for causing the collision and is penalised by a 5 (FIVE) grid place penalty at the next round of the Championship at which the penalty can be taken in full.

Evidence Relied Upon:

On board video was reviewed from Cars 55, 59 and Car 9 (following).

Accordingly, under Motorsport UK NCR Ch.5a App.5 Art.2.1, I hereby order that you receive the following:
