Following investigations, I find that you are guilty of contravening the following Motorsport UK NCR(s):

Ch.12 App.8 Art.1.7.j Failure to comply with Red Flag signals

Brief Details:

Oscar was spoken to after he was reported for passing the pit entrance after seeing the red flag instead of returning to the pit lane as per the event final instructions, thus completing a further lap of the circuit before returning to the pit lane. Due to the length of the circuit, this took 3:19:524. Driver was honest and said he was unfamiliar with Silverstone and was therefore needed to ask 'where the pit lane was'. When asked, Oscar openly admitted that for a number of years, he hadn't been to Silverstone.

Driver advised to spend sometime before each meeting familiarising himself with the venue & layout or at the drivers briefing, ask questions if unsure.

Evidence Relied Upon:

Print out from timekeepers showing the double passing of the red flag.

Accordingly, under Motorsport UK NCR Ch.5a App.5 Art.2.1, I hereby order that you receive the following:

Disqualified from Practice / Permitted to start from rear of the grid
Number of Licence Penalty Points: 4
