Following investigations, I find that you are guilty of contravening the following Motorsport UK NCR(s):

Ch.12 App.7 Art.1.8 Causing a collision, repetition of serious mistakes or the appearance of a lack of control over the car (such as leaving the track) will be reported to the Clerk of Course and may entail the imposition of penalties up to and including the disqualification of any driver concerned.

**Brief Details:**

On the approach to Turn 1 Post 2.0 on the first lap of the Monoposto Championship Race 1 (Race 6 on timetable) on Saturday 9th August 25 Car 10 Neil Harrison and Car 68 Malcolm Scott made contact, resulting in Car 68 retiring with damaged suspension and Car 10 spun and continued.

Video evidence from Car 68 and Car 32 Terry Clark which was behind the cars involved in the incident was viewed in the presence of both drivers and each provided their views on the incident.

Car 10 was seen to be towards the centre of the track prior to the incident but appeared to move to drivers left slightly which resulted in Car 10 making L/H contact to front R/H of Car 68 resulting in Car 10 spinning in front of Car 68.

Accordingly, under Motorsport UK NCR Ch.5a App.5 Art.2.1, I hereby order that you receive the following:
