Following investigations, I find that you are guilty of contravening the following Motorsport UK NCR(s):

Ch.12 App.7 Art.1.8 Causing a collision, repetition of serious mistakes or the appearance of a lack of control over the car (such as leaving the track) will be reported to the Clerk of Course and may entail the imposition of penalties up to and including the disqualification of any driver concerned.

Brief Details:

It was reported by several marshals, and the timekeepers, that car 96 was "pushing" car 93 across the finish line on the last lap of the race. Photographic evidence from the timekeeper's high speed camera was reviewed and presented to the driver.

The driver of car 96 (Kevan McLurg) was interviewed by myself and fellow Clerk of the Course Nigel Tanser, where he stated that the reason he was pushing him was that "they were racing" and the other driver had been consistently slow out of the corner for three laps.

I find that, despite the arguments of the driver of car 96, he knew that the car in front was consistently slower than himself and such a manoeuvre was not necessary to get past car 93.

As such, a ten second time penalty will be applied to the race time of car 96 for causing a collision.

Accordingly, under Motorsport UK NCR Ch.5a App.5 Art.2.1, I hereby order that you receive the following:

Addition of time to your race time (Stated below) Number of Licence Penalty Points: 3

Additional Comments: 10 seconds added to race time.

You are reminded of your right of appeal. Any penalties applied will be recorded by Motorsport UK in accordance with NCR Ch.5a App.5 Art.2.3
